

Academic opening in **Macroeconomics and Finance**  
UCL Department of Economics (Louvain-la-Neuve, Belgium)

**Description**

The Department of Economics of the Université catholique of Louvain seeks to fill a full-time faculty position (tenure track or tenured) in macroeconomics and finance. We have a particular interest in candidates with evidence of and/or high potential for successful research in areas including, but not limited to, business cycle analysis, international economics and finance, institutions and regulations, monetary macroeconomics and/or the macroeconomic analysis of the labor market. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to work in an exciting research environment.

**Selection criteria**

Applicants must have completed a Ph.D. or be near completion. The successful candidate will be expected to maintain a strong research program in his(her) area of specialization, provide high quality teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and supervise graduate student research. Candidates should note that courses are taught mainly in French but also in English. Fluency in French at the time of application is not required to be considered for the position; however, the ability to teach in French is valued.

**Application procedure**

The application package will contain: (1) a cover letter, (2) a complete curriculum vitae, (3) a copy of the final degree, (4) a complete bibliography and copies of the most important publications, (5) a text of about 3500 characters describing current and future research, (6) a text of about 3500 characters describing teaching approaches, and (7) three letters of recommendations.
