Teaching methods :	<p>Students take part to various research activities in applied mathematics organized at UCL, namely the following (reading) seminars:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Systems and Control seminar - Optimization and Mathematical Programming seminar - Large Graphs and Networks seminar <p>(researchers and professors from UCL or other universities present recent research works)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reading seminar in Optimization and Operations Research - Reading seminar in Large Graphs and Networks <p>(these reading seminars are devoted to the study of historically important articles, or exciting recent developments)</p> <p>The type and number of activities will be determined at the beginning of the semester by the students according to their scientific interests, in agreement with the coordinator, so that the total amount of work corresponds to 3 ECTS.</p>
