Teaching methods	<p>Learning with teaching or authentic material (listening and reading comprehension).</p> <p>Consolidation and extension of basic vocabulary and the basic structures of the Russian language by means of written or oral exercises (drills, role-plays, interviews, discussion in small groups of 2 up to 4).</p>
