General Conditions

Except as otherwise provided by other special legal provisions and with a view to obtaining the academic degree that recognises them, admission to undergraduate courses is granted to students with either:

- A certificate of Further Secondary Education issued from the academic year 1993–1994 by a fully fledged secondary education establishment or a school of Continuing Education in the French Community and approved by the Board created for that purpose, and holders of the same certificate issued from the 1994 calendar year by the education board of the French Community;
- or a certificate of Further Secondary Education issued not later than the end of the school year 1992–1993 accompanied, for admission to degree-length undergraduate studies, by a proficiency diploma giving access to higher education;
- or a diploma issued by a higher education establishment of the French Community recognising an academic degree, or a diploma issued by a university institution or an establishment dispensing full-time higher education under previous legislation;
- or a higher education certificate issued by an improvement courses establishment;
- a pass certificate for one of the [entrance examinations](#) co-ordinated by the higher education establishments or by a French Community education board and whose curricula are approved by the Government after consultation, according to the sector, with the Interuniversity Council of the French Community (Conseil interuniversitaire de la Communauté française – CIUF) or the General Council of the Hautes Ecoles (Conseil général des Hautes Ecoles – CGHE); this certificate gives admission to studies in relevant sectors or fields;
- or a diploma, certificate or secondary school certificate similar to those mentioned above issued by the Flemish Community (this certificate does not give exemption from the [French Language Proficiency](#) exam), by the German-speaking Community or the Royal Military School;
- of a diploma, certificate or secondary school certificate outside Belgium and recognised as equivalent to those mentioned above.

Requests for equivalence must be submitted to the [Service des équivalences](#) of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the French Community of Belgium before 15 July 2013.

Notes: the two following certificates are automatically recognised as equivalent to the Certificate of Upper Secondary Education (Certificat d'enseignement secondaire supérieur – CESS): the European baccalaureat issued by the High Council of European Schools; the international baccalaureate issued by the International Baccalaureate Office, Geneva.

However, neither certificate automatically gives exemption from the [French Language Proficiency](#) exam;

- or a proficiency diploma giving access to higher education (diplôme d'aptitude à accéder à l'enseignement supérieur – DAES) conferred by the French Community examination board.

Exam of knowledge of the French language

Anyone not demonstrating sufficient [French language proficiency](#) will not be admitted to the first-year undergraduate examinations.

Learning outcomes

The bachelor's program of Religious Studies aims to provide a thorough grounding in theological reflection. In these studies, the student will be confronted with the foundations of theological reflection; he will become acquainted with the working tools which will equip him with a specific and rigorous approach to studying the texts of the Bible and tradition, the historical roots of the questions which are posed and the present-day thinkers who endeavor to supply the answers. Focus is placed on the acquisition of working methodology specific to the great domains of theology.

Theology is not a science constructed in isolation. It mirrors social values, is linked to history and philosophy. It is dependent on psychological and sociological realities, what justifies the integration of courses of other human sciences in the curriculum.

The knowledge and skills to be acquired throughout the bachelor's program of Religious Studies are three-fold.

- Firstly, the student is trained in the correct use of the "tools" and strategies for learning how to learn (grasping the methodology linked to the diversity of the sources and the knowledge of languages other than French (English, biblical Greek, Latin)).
- Secondly, they are taught to master the concepts required in order to develop a theological thought.
- And thirdly, they are introduced to a number of theological fields, in which they will develop their analytical skills, according to the theological discipline.

Teaching method

The program is thought to support interactive participation of the students in the various theological disciplines.

In first year, the seminar "Methodology of the theology" (which includes a mentoring and an obligatory tutoring) aims at an optimal coaching of the group of the students and each one in particular. In Bachelor 1 (BAC 1), a theoretical and practical initiation with the instruments of basic work and research will be ensured by the professors of all the main domains of the theology. In second and third years, the activities envisage a volume of consequent work to develop an active pedagogy initiating the student with a participative approach for the various theological disciplines.

Evaluation

The evaluation will be conducted by means of the most appropriate forms of assessment decided on by the lecturers, in coherence with the objectives outlined in the course specifications. Except some [activities](#), the courses are evaluated during the evaluation periods. Most of the exams are oral.

Teaching methods are evaluated in accordance with the current University regulations (see [General regulations concerning examinations](#)). Students may also find additional information regarding the evaluation of courses in the course description.

specifically:

In first year of Bachelor program, the seminar "General methodology of theology" aims to collect the complementarity of the positive theology (biblical exegesis and history), systematic theology and practical theology. Tutoring (with a teacher chosen by the student) and coaching (with a faculty assistant) complement the methodological dimension of the formation. This will be evaluated throughout the year.

In the second and third years of the Bachelor program, an overall evaluation takes place at the end in the form of a more developed paper.

Mobility and/or Internationalisation outlook

The Faculty of Theology gives the students the opportunity to complete part of their studies abroad (via the Erasmus or Mercator exchange schemes) from the third year of the bachelor in Religious Studies.

Programme structure

The bachelor in Religious Studies (180 credits) is composed of one single line of studies (major, 150 credits), common to all, and a minor of 30 credits (2 x 15 credits in 2nd and 3rd year).

The **major** one in Religious Studies is made up of :

- Initiation aux différents domaines de la théologie et des sciences des religions (75 crédits)
- des cours à choisir (21 crédits) dans chacune des matières de l'Ancien Testament, du Nouveau Testament, de l'Histoire du Christianisme, de la Théologie fondamentale, de l'Initiation chrétienne, de l'Introduction aux religions, et de la Théologie pratique.
- Introduction in all the main disciplines of the theology and religious studies (75 credits)
- Philosophy (Introduction, Anthropology, Metaphysics, Epistemology) (21 credits)
- Ancient Languages (Biblical Greek and Latin) (11 credits)
- Modern Language (English) (6 credits)
- Methodology of Theology, Heuristics and final dissertation (16 credits)
- Courses to be chosen in: Biblical Exegesis (Old and New Testament) ; Reflection on Dogma ; Ethics ; History of Religions ; Practical Theology (21 credits)

The first year of the program is made up exclusively of obligatory courses (60 credits) ensuring an introduction to the basic disciplines as well in theology, methodology, as in philosophy and social sciences.

As from the second year, the student will complete his major by a **minor** of his choice in Theology and in Religious Sciences by additional courses for a total of 30 credits or by a **minor** in another Faculty (Philosophy and other sciences, useful for the studies in Theology, are highly recommended).

A possible reorientation of the studies is possible at the end of the first year of bachelor who exempts courses in several disciplines of the social sciences, for example of the Faculty of Philosophy, Arts and Letters (FIAL).

A progressive specialization of the student is possible by the means of the inscription to university certificates EBIB19CE *Certificate in biblical studies* and SREL9CE *Certificate in Religious Sciences* for an admission respectively in EBIB12M *Master in biblical studies* or SREL2M *Master in Religious Sciences*
