Main themes	<p>This course deals with word order variation in Dutch. The approach is both theoretical and empirical.</p> <p>From a theoretical point of view, the matter of word order variation is addressed through a selection of research articles analysing the phenomena of the syntagmatic variation in Dutch.</p> <p>From an empirical point of view, students will replicate one of the linguistic studies by applying methods and analyses in the field of corpus linguistics.</p>
