ARKE2M1 - Teaching profile

Learning outcomes

The Master in the History of Art and Archeology : General (60 credits) aims to deepen the methodological and critical learning of archeology and history of art.

This master provides a second level training of a less specialised nature than the 120 course, but is just as complete as regards learning. It is proposed particularly with Bachelors in the History of Art and Archeology in mind who do not want to specialise in a particular focus.

The individual final project examines a subject with a critical eye and a rigour inline with university standards.

On successful completion of this programme, each student is able to :

- 1.4. Penser et agir dans la multi- et l'interdisciplinarité en s'ouvrant à d'autres cadres conceptuels et méthodologiques en vue non seulement d'engranger des connaissances mais d'être capable de construire soi-même ce savoir.

2. Maîtriser des savoirs

Maîtriser de manière active et intégrée un corpus de savoirs disciplinaires et pluridisciplinaires (connaissances, terminologies, problématiques, méthodes, cadres conceptuels) indispensables pour agir avec expertise dans les différents domaines de l'archéologie et de l'histoire de l'art.

- 2.1. Maîtriser un socle de savoirs dans plusieurs domaines de l'archéologie et de l'histoire de l'art.
- 2.2. Maîtriser des savoirs spécialisés dans l'un ou l'autre domaine plus spécifique.
- 2.3. À partir des savoirs acquis, contribuer au développement de nouveaux savoirs dans les domaines de l'archéologie, de l'histoire de l'art, en lien avec les pratiques professionnelles de ces disciplines.

3. Appliquer les méthodologies disciplinaires

Étudier et analyser une Œuvre ou un objet, un corpus, un site, une problématique complexe en convoquant les méthodologies propres aux disciplines de l'archéologie et de l'histoire de l'art et en aiguisant son regard critique.

- 3.1. Étudier une Œuvre ou un objet, un site, un corpus particulier à travers une analyse formelle, technique, iconographique et iconologique en convoquant diverses approches disciplinaires.
- 3.2. Être capable de les resituer dans leur contexte historique et socio-culturel, d'en comprendre les interactions et les enjeux.
- 3.3. Réfléchir à l'apport de nouvelles méthodes et faire évoluer ces méthodes dans un souci d'adaptation aux situations concrètes et diverses.

4. Effectuer une recherche en appliquant une démarche scientifique

Mener à bien un travail de recherche original et personnel brassant une quantité importante et diversifiée d'informations selon une démarche systématique et rigoureuse.

- 4.1. Construire et traiter des problématiques spécifiques autour d'un sujet donné. Faire preuve d'un raisonnement clair et structuré en appliquant, et en adaptant, si nécessaire, des cadres conceptuels donnés.
- 4.2. Effectuer une recherche documentaire sur un sujet : collecter une grande quantité d'informations (sources secondaires et primaires) et en sélectionner les plus pertinentes.
- 4.3. Analyser une quantité importante d'informations : décrire, organiser et synthétiser les données de manière systématique et rigoureuse. Critiquer et confronter les documents.
- 4.4. Interroger le corpus d'informations de manière pertinente : y appliquer les méthodologies disciplinaires tout en y apportant son propre regard réflexif et critique, construisant un travail neuf et personnel sur la problématique.
- 4.5. Communiquer de manière scientifique et pédagogique, oralement et par écrit, les résultats de sa recherche.

5. Gérer de façon autonome son travail et son parcours de développement

Faire preuve d'une capacité d'autonomie dans la gestion d'une recherche, d'un projet personnel et plus largement dans la mise à jour de ses connaissances.

- 5.1. Gérer en autonomie un travail de recherche en appliquant une démarche scientifique et en mobilisant les savoirs acquis dans l'établissement d'états des questions sur des problématiques ou des objets de recherche spécifiques, pluridisciplinaires le cas échéant.

- 5.3. Développer sa curiosité intellectuelle : être intéressé et ouvert aux perspectives d'évolution et de changement tant dans le domaine des connaissances que dans celui des méthodes de médiation de ces savoirs.
- 5.4. Être acteur de sa formation : gérer de manière autonome l'acquisition et la mise à jour de ses connaissances et de ses savoir-faire.
- 5.5. Gérer son temps et planifier les étapes de la réalisation d'un projet.

6. Etre ouvert sur le monde culturel et socioprofessionnel

Admission

General and specific admission requirements for this program must be satisfied at the time of enrolling at the university..

Specific Admission Requirements

2° Provide proof of a sufficient level in French ([B1 of the European Framework of Reference](#) )

3° Student must have training including the following 120 credits:

- ⇒ 30 credits in general training courses and seminars;
- ⇒ 23 credits in introductory courses to the discipline;
- ⇒ 20 credits in art and civilisation courses;
- ⇒ 5 credits in courses in introduction to the scientific practice;
- ⇒ 3 credits in technology courses;
- ⇒ 24 credits in methodology courses;
- ⇒ 15 credits in ancient, medieval and/or modern languages courses.

The 30 credits of the [Minor in History of Art and Archeology \[30.0\]](#) satisfy these requirements.

If the student does not have enough training in one or several of these subjects, prerequisites will be added to the masters programme (maximum 15 credits).

If the total number of prerequisites exceeds 15 credits, access to the master is subject to the student passing an additional year, the programme of which is established based on the student's file.

Course equivalences are submitted for approval to the chairman of the jury, the secretary of the jury and the academic faculty secretary.
